Connecting your department with industry

Professional skills lectures

We can work with you to host a professional skills lecture for your final year students. Each lecture runs for one to two hours and is given by a professional working in industry from our IET partnership community, comprising Corporate, MOD and Enterprise Partners.

THE LECTURE CONSISTS OF TWO CORE SESSIONS:

- **1 Technical** providing an insight into the type of work students can expect after graduation.
- **2 Employability skills** your students will learn to make a great first impression to prospective employers through accurate self-assessment and effective interview techniques.

An optional session - 'making an impact with your CV' can be provided. The IET will work directly with the university employability office and careers department to give your students information on how to create the perfect professional CV.

These events are exclusively for IET Academic Partner departments who have fulfilled their IET student membership criteria. We require six weeks lead time to obtain an industry speaker and a minimum of 35 students must be registered to attend the lecture one week prior to the event. The IET expects your department to advertise the lecture to your students. To enquire about holding a professional skills lecture, please contact your Account Manager for further details.

Get more out of accreditation


IET accreditation demonstrates the quality and relevance of your programmes to potential students and employers. In recognition of the significant work involved in seeking and maintaining accreditation, we offer the following support to Higher Education institutions

- help with making your initial application
- a one-day advisory visit, including a report and recommendations
- a training day for two members of staff
- transparent and detailed guidance available online via our bespoke accreditation management system (ADAMS)
- a two-day accreditation visit (normally at least two academics, one industrialist and one member of IET staff)
- the ability to track the accreditation process via ADAMS
- an accreditation visit report and action plan
- weekday access to advice via telephone or email
- a dedicated member of staff for your visit
- an annual report and health check
- advice on the suitability of any new programmes for accreditation

- facilitation of joint visits
- advice on modifying programmes to meet particular levels of accreditation
- advice on aligning programmes and department/university regulations with IET policy and UK-SPEC
- a re-accreditation visit every five years
- advice and support on partnerships and getting your franchised programmes accredited.

Support on the journey to becoming professionally registered

As part of your accreditation status, 50% of your teaching staff needs to be professionally registered. This requirement is intended to ensure high standards, demonstrate transferable skills, up-to-date professional competence and continued professional development.

The IET is licensed by the Engineering Council to award the professional engineering and ICT qualifications: Engineering Technician (EngTech), ICT Technician (ICT Tech), Incorporated Engineer (IEng) and Chartered Engineer (CEng). These globally recognised professional qualifications indicate a high level of competence and commitment to remain at the forefront of developments within the profession; something that is equally valued by employers and clients.

We also offer Chartered IT Professional (CITP) through the BCS, the Chartered Institute for IT, and have partnered with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI) to offer IET members a route to qualify as a Chartered Manager (CMgr).

As an Academic Partner you can request on campus professional registration workshops and advisory sessions for academic and technical staff and researchers.





UNIVERSITY BASED REGISTRATION SCHEMES

We can support you in reaching CEng or IEng registration through a University Based Registration Scheme (UBRS). These tailored schemes aim to develop staff members and provide a structured pathway to achieving professional registration.

Subject to sufficient numbers, your scheme can be tailored with pre-agreed timescales for:

- on campus professional registration workshops
- on campus 1:2:1 meetings with a Professional Registration Advisor (PRA)
- submission of draft application forms for PRA feedback
- submission of final application forms for assessment



Embedding Career Manager into your modules

Create the structure for career progression around building and maintaining competences: the recognised knowledge, skills and attributes needed to deliver results in a chosen field. Having a professional development plan means the IET can support students in reaching their goals faster and more effectively.

IET CAREER MANAGER

Career Manager is a professional development recording and planning tool that can support students throughout their engineering career. Career Manager provides students with the opportunity to develop valuable skills in recording competence development in the appropriate language, in addition to building a master CV record.

Students can:

- access Career Manager at any time from any internet-ready device
- record technical and professional skills evidence developed from university projects and industrial placements
- set development objectives, plan actions and track progress
- familiarise themselves with industry specific frameworks
- create and maintain a professional looking CV
- present a competence record to prospective employers.

Students using Career Manager will leave university ready to start documenting their career development in preparation for professional registration as a Chartered or Incorporated Engineer.

If you want to support your students in focussing their learning on recognised industry standards, planning the next steps in their career and concentrating on work-readiness then ask your Account Manager about integrating Career Manager within employability modules or industrial placements.



IET FARADAY — BRINGING SCIENCE TO LIFE IN THE CLASSROOM

Hosting a Faraday Challenge Day

IET Faraday is our flagship programme for primary and secondary schools that aims to deliver an engineering and technology context by using case studies and real life examples from around the world. The programme includes:

- Faraday teaching resources Free cross-curricular classroom activities with supporting files such as PowerPoint presentations and handouts that can be tailored to the needs of students.
- Faraday Challenge Days An annual competition delivered in schools for teams of six pupils in Year 8. Teams are given the opportunity to research, design, develop and make creative solutions to genuinely tough engineering problems with the top team winning a prize and a trophy for their school. A limited number of free opportunities are offered to Academic Partners to host a Faraday Challenge Day and enhance their schools outreach.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Universities act as a host and invite local schools to take part, with the assistance from the university's own engineering students. This is a great way to inspire people about engineering and give them a view into undergraduate life at your university.

FIRST® LEGO® LEAGUE AND FIRST® LEGO® LEAGUE JR.

FIRST® LEGO® League is a global robotics-based, life skills competition for teams of students aged 9 – 16 years. The challenge is to design, build and program a robot to autonomously complete a set of missions using LEGO Education Mindstorms equipment.

The teams also have to research a real world topic, identify a problem and create an innovative solution. Collaborating with organisations to share their ideas and presenting their work to the judges develops their communication skills. The *FIRST*® LEGO® League core values are a central part of the programme as the young people learn skills like problem-solving and critical thinking that will help prepare them for life beyond school.

Teams compete at their regional tournament and have the opportunity to progress to the national and international finals.

FIRST® LEGO® League Junior is a brilliant programme for younger children aged 6 – 9 years. Based on similar Core Values to FIRST® LEGO® League, the teams have to design and build a moving LEGO model using LEGO Education WeDo 2.0 equipment. There is a project challenge based on the topic for the season and the team have to present their work on a Show Me poster. The Expo events where the teams demonstrate all their work are great fun and encourage the children to get involved with STEM subjects.




EDUCATION PARTNERS
