Run by students, for students, IET On Campus is your opportunity to connect with your community and kickstart your career with confidence.



With IET On Campus, you'll be able to:


Network and engage with professional communities, such as our Young Professionals, Local Networks and Technical Networks.

Form your committee

IET On Campus groups must have a minimum of four main committee members covering a range of roles. We recommend also having a member of university staff to recognise and help your student society.

Plan your events

Once you're set up, you can plan your event schedule for the year.

Think of what you'd like to accomplish and how much funding you might need to request.



Apply for funding

Request funding for your event by completing the **funding request form**. Make sure to review the On Campus **funding process**.



Run your event

You should have all the tools necessary to run a successful event or activity. Keep track of the number of attendees and let us know after your event by completing a **metrics form**.





Plan your succession

Send us a succession form each time there is a change in your committee.

IET On Campus Documents and Resources

Must haves for managing your IET On Campus group:

- At least one person in the committee must be an IET member – usually this is the Chair of the group (see types of roles for more information).
- 2. Make sure to use our marketing toolkit to help with IET On Campus branding.
- Keep us updated! Get in touch with your dedicated IET contact to report attendee numbers (metrics form) and any committee changes or updates (succession form).

Types of roles

Here's some of the roles and responsibilities members of our IET On Campus groups take on. Feel free to create or adapt roles to best suit the needs of your committee.

Chair

Makes sure the committee follows processes, guidelines and policies outlined by IET staff.

Arranges the succession plan to make sure the committee stays balanced after any transitions.

Vice Chair

Works with the Treasurer on the funding application form for events funding.

Deputises for the Chair when they are unable to fulfil their duties.

Treasurer

Responsible for completing and submitting the funding application form and ensuring the committee follows the IET On Campus funding processes and guidelines.

In charge of all things financial, the Treasurer provides financial reports and guidance to the committee to make the most of (and stay within) the budget.

Secretary

The co-ordinator of committee team meetings, responsible for circulating agendas, group action lists, and any information received from the IET.

Continued communication with faculty staff, reserving university venues and gathering resources.

Types of roles

Organising IET On Campus events

Planning events, physical or virtual, are the best way to network and promote your IET On Campus group.

Members of your group will also have access to our online registration portal, which you can use to take bookings for events, both virtual and physical. Request this through your dedicated IET contact and we'll get you started on the relevant training required.


Boards and Committees
