

FIRST® LEGO® League Challenge is a global robotics-based life skills competition for young people (aged 9-16 years) that encourages an interest in real-world issues and develops valuable skills such as team working, problem-solving and creative thinking.

Each season an important global topic is chosen and, through research, the young people identify a problem associated with this theme. Teams are challenged to design an innovative solution which they present to the judges at their tournament. The teams also have to design, build and program an autonomous LEGO® robot to solve several missions in a limited time on the competition mat.

Throughout all these tasks they demonstrate the *FIRST®* LEGO® League Core Values which include teamwork, inclusion and problem-solving.

Teams can participate in school events or attend a regional tournament. Top performing teams go onto compete at a national and international level.

Who's it for?

Researchers who have started their PhD or EngD research programme, with a minimum of one year's IET membership*.

What's on offer?

Seven awards are available:

- Three x £2,500 prizes
- Three x £5,000 prizes
- One x £10,000 prize

Awarded on a competitive basis for excellence. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to interview.

What else do I need to know?

- You'll need to have achieved a 2:1 or higher in your first degree
- You can be in any year of your PhD or EngD research programme, but you must have started it by the application deadline
- You can apply for an award if you have a student loan, research grant, company bursary, or similar, or have won an IET Travel Award or IET scholarship or bursary
- The panel will consider you for all postgraduate research awards you are eligible for
- You'll need to include details of your referee on your application
- If you're successful, you can only receive one IET Postgraduate Research Award during your PhD research

What's on offer?


We award grants of up to £1,500. A maximum of of 75% of the total cost of your visit would be funded by the IET.

- If you have already received an IET Travel Award, a year must have passed before you can apply again
- A reference is required to support your application

IET Achievement Medals

These awards recognise individuals who have made exceptional contributions to the advancement of engineering and technology, either through research and development, through their leadership of an enterprise, or through their inspiring efforts as early career professionals or IET volunteers. All awards are open to global nominations.

Prestige medals

Established career

We award up to four Prestige Medals each year to individuals who have made major and distinguished contributions in the various sectors of engineering, technology or applied science.

The Faraday Medal For scientific or industrial contributions

The Mountbatten Medal For the fields of electronics or IT

The Mensforth Manufacturing Gold Medal

The J J Thomson Medal for Electronics



Achievement Medals

There are up to five Achievement Medals available each year. These are awarded to individuals who have made an impact in any sector of engineering and technology.

Who are they for?

Established career professionals in engineering and technology. You don't need to be a member to nominate or be nominated. Established career means anyone who is, allowing for career breaks, more than 10 years from the start of their first employment in engineering or technology.

What's on offer?

All winners will receive a medal, certificate and a year's free membership of the IET.

The Faraday and Mountbatten Medallists will also be invited to sign the Roll of Honour.

Our prestige medals have been added to the Government's Global Talent Visa List which means that international holders of these prizes can apply for a visa to live or work in the UK for up to five years, and extend beyond that if they wish.

For early career, established career, and volunteers



Early career

These awards focus on the outstanding work, significant career progress, and contributions of early career professionals to their industry or profession. Early career means someone who is, allowing for career breaks, within 10 years of the start of their first employment in engineering or technology.

Who are they for?

Sir Henry Royce Medal

for the most significant progression achieved **over a period of more than three years**.

Mike Sargeant Medal

for true excellence in the workplace achieved within the last three years.

You don't need to be a member to nominate or be nominated for either award.

What's on offer?

All winners will receive a medal, certificate and a year's free membership of the IET, plus:

Sir Henry Royce Medal: £250 prize money

Mike Sargeant Medal: £500 prize money

Volunteer

These awards celebrate the outstanding contributions of our volunteers as they help to further the aims of the IET.

Who are they for?

IET Volunteer Medal: individuals engaged in an IET volunteering role for at least one year.

Paul Fletcher Medal: early career IET volunteers. The nominee must be a member of the IET, but the nominator does not.





What's on offer?

All winners will receive a medal, certificate and a year's free membership of the IET, plus:

Paul Fletcher Medal: £250 prize money

What else do I need to know?

All nominations should provide a concise, complete, and verifiable description of the impact and influence of the individual both to their profession and wider society, with specific reference to their work as an engineer, technologist, technical leader/ manager, or academic, as appropriate.

Volunteer nominations should clearly show how the nominee has worked to further the aims of the IET or has exemplified the IET's values and behaviours.

Other factors can enhance nominations where appropriate, like engineering ambassadorial activities and STEM promotion, or for volunteers – contributions to the IET's mission and strategy.

IET Apprentice and Technician Awards

Engineering and Technology Apprentice Award

Award for an individual on an IET Accredited Apprenticeship Scheme making great progress towards the apprenticeship qualifications and who has made substantial contributions towards their employer or operational area.

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to attend the Achievement Awards ceremony in October where the winner will be revealed.

Who's it for?

Apprentices on an IET Accredited Apprenticeship scheme. Open to IET members and non-members.



What's on offer?

- Trophy and certificate presented at the Achievement Awards ceremony in London in October
- £1,000 prize
- Two year's free membership to the IET

What else do I need to know?

There are two ways to enter this award. You can either nominate someone else or make a self-nomination. If you selfnominate, you must have a referee who will support your application.

Nominees must:

- Be on, or have recently completed, an IET Accredited Apprenticeship
- Be making good progress towards the apprenticeship qualifications, or have recently completed their apprenticeship
- Have made a substantial contribution towards the development of a new product, service or process that demonstrates outstanding understanding of engineering principles
- Have evidence of engineering ambassadorial work (schools, volunteer work, role model)

IET Armed Forces Technician Award

Awarded to an individual in recognition of an exceptional engineering contribution in developing a product, service or process or the completion of a project. They will also have demonstrated outstanding commitment to engineering or technology through technical and professional development.

We welcome nominations for Armed Forces Technicians who are current serving members of the United Kingdom Armed Forces.

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to attend the Achievement Awards ceremony in October where the winner will be revealed.

Who's it for?

Open to IET members and non-members.

What's on offer?

- Trophy and certificate presented at the IET Achievement Awards ceremony in London in October
- £1,000 prize
- Two year's free membership to the IET



What else do I need to know?

Churchill Medal

The Churchill Medal, named in honour of Sir Winston Churchill, was first awarded in 1952. Sir Winston, who expressed great enthusiasm for this award, reflected on the important contribution made by engineers of all disciplines to the military needs in the Second World War.

The medal is awarded jointly by the IET, Institute of Marine Engineering, Science and Technology (IMarEST), the Royal Aeronautical Society (RAeS), the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE), the Institution of Royal Engineers (InstRE), the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE), the Society of Operations Engineers (SOE) and the British Computer Society (BCS).

Who's it for?

The award is for an individual or a small team (the majority of whom are serving members of the armed forces or were serving at the time) for achievement in engineering and technical advancement in support of the development and use of capability to support military operations/readiness during the period 2023/2024.



What's on offer?

A medal and certificate presented at an award ceremony in London on 14 November 2024.

The Churchill Medal Award is judged against five main criteria:

- Operational Effect
- Innovation
- Difficulty
- Complexity
- Efficiency.

What else do I need to know?

Winning nominations will need to demonstrate strong evidence in all of these criteria and be an example of someone going above and beyond.

Nominators will be required to complete a nomination form which will be available to download from the website when nominations open in March 2024.

A set of awards all about celebrating the world's greatest teams.

IET Young Woman Engineer of the Year Awards

These prestigious awards are all about breaking the stereotype and shining a light on outstanding women engineers up and down the country.

By showcasing some of the UK's most outstanding talent, we want to encourage more women to join the wonderful world of engineering.

The prizes

The IET Young Woman Engineer of the Year Award is for:

- Engineering ability and competence, regardless of level of registration
- Evidence of initiative and ability to be an able ambassador, representing women in engineering and acting as an inspirational role model

The Mary George Memorial Prize for Apprentices is for:

- Young women currently employed in UK apprenticeships, within any discipline of engineering
- Women who have finished their apprenticeship within the last six months before the closing date may also be considered for this award

The Women's Engineering Society (WES) Prize is for:
